## The Corner Unit

This crag is an extension of the routes established here in 2019, including the popular two-pitch outing "Condo Crack". A large wall, 30m tall and 15 routes wide with a few routes at each grade from 5.6 to 5.10 and a pleasant base area. Lots of morning sun, afternoon shade and a quick 5-minute approach. A standard Squamish rack to 3" will be good for most. All the routes can be climbed with a 60m rope aside from "Condo Crack", which requires a 70m or better yet, a walk-off. The first few routes on the right side of the wall are a full 30m, so tie a knot and be careful when lowering. Many variations are possible, so get creative and enjoy.

Approach is via the Papoose descent trail. From the Shannon Falls access intersection with Highway 99, a good trail heads up to an immediate fork. Stay left (right goes to the main Papoose climbing area) and hike for 5 minutes. An obvious fork goes to the left and reaches the crag in 1 more minute. Climbs on the backside (not listed here) are 1 minute beyond this wall.

- Corner Unit 5.8 \*\*\*\*

  The aesthetic arête holds really nice pickets, dyke holds and great position. SR, 6 bolts 30m FA Nick McNutt 2019
- Income Suite 5.10a \*\*\*\*

  Sustained climbing past bolts leads to a nice layback crack up high. SR, 6 bolts 30m FA Nick McNutt 2019
- Strata Fees 5.9 \*\*\*
  Climb past a bolt to a short finger crack. Fun climbing through the pocketed face above leads to the shared anchor with "Income Suite". A small cam (green alien) protects the moves after the first bolt. The original line moved right into "Income Suite" after the second bolt.

  SR. 5 bolts 30m FA Nick McNutt 2019
- Condo Crack 5.6 \*\*\*\*

  A great introductory multi-pitch climb, with great views up high. Some may wish to bring double cams from #.75 to #2 for extra comfort on P1. Please be mindful of others and use the easy walk-off along the ridge to the south if its busy, otherwise it can be rappelled with a 70m rope.

  Pitch 1: Head up the fun crack for 34m to the big ledge and a bolted anchor.

  Pitch 2: Move the belay left 10m to another anchor. Climb nice cracks past a few horizontal breaks to the top of the wall. Walk off along the ridge to gain the main descent trail.

- Down Payment 5.6 \*\*\*

  Another good, easy crack climb that can also be linked into *Condo Crack* if desired. SR, 25m *FA Nick McNutt 2021*
- Market Value 5.7 \*\*\*
  Climb up past a bolt to reach the short hand crack. Bolts and gear lead up the nice face above. SR, 6 bolts 25m FA Chris Small 2021

- 7 Climb easily to reach a thin, technical slab protected with closely spaced bolts. Easier climbing above past horizontal cracks and a move left to the shared anchor with "Priced Out". SR, 5 bolts 25m FA Nick McNutt 2021
- Priced Out 5.7 \*\*\*\*

  Climb the nice lightning-bolt shaped crack to its top, where an exciting face move leads to a couple of horizontal breaks. 2 bolts above lead through some great face climbing through pockets. Good value for a modest grade!

  SR, 2 bolts 25m FA Nick McNutt 2021
- Call an Arborist 5.8 \*\*\*\*

  The obvious, deep crack marks the start of this route. Head straight up it, past a couple of horizontal cracks and a steeper section of the wall. Bolts protect a thin sequence moving left, and moving up too far will feel hard for the grade. Shared anchor with "Bidding War". SR, 3 bolts 25m FA Chris Small 2021
- Bidding War 5.9 \*\*\*

  Takes the fully-bolted line to the left of the deep crack to a crux up near the top of the wall. 9 bolts, 25m FA Nick McNutt 2021
- Counteroffer 5.6 \*\*

  Head up past 2 bolts to a thin move gaining some easier broken cracks. Trust your feet!

  SR, 2 bolts 24m FA Nick McNutt 2021
- Stress Test 5.10a \*\*
  Takes the line of black bolts. Faith in your shoe rubber will keep the stress levels to a minimum. 8 bolts, 24m FA Jeff Thomson 2021
- Capital Gains 5.8 \*\*

  Climb up to a thought-provoking sequence at the 3rd bolt. Easier gear protected climbing above leads to the anchor.

  SR, 4 bolts 24m FA Nick McNutt 2021
- Curb Appeal 5.7 \*\*\*
  Face climb past some short cracks and face features to a ledge. Some more easier climbing reaches a shared anchor with "Blown Budget".

  SR, 4 bolts 23m FA Nick McNutt 2021
- Blown Budget 5.8 \*\*
  The left-most route is a good test of your faith in friction. Climbing too far to the right will feel harder than the given grade...
  7 bolts, 23m FA Nick McNutt 2021
